Program Description: Provides food supplies for food insecure households.

Program Details:

1. Eligibility Requirements: No Requirements
2. Application/Intake Process: Pantry participants are asked to fill out a form and provide proof of residency, the number of dependents, names and birth dates of each household member (i.e. for a child, that can be an immunization card, birth certificate, report card, etc.), and valid identification. Homeless persons may use the address of a local service agency.
3. Food delivery process: (Patron's Choice)
 - a. Recipients fill in an order form and turn the form into a volunteer upon arrival at the pantry. The food items will then be selected and boxed and brought out to the recipient's vehicle.
 - b. Recipients come into the pantry to shop for needed items.
4. Emergency food: Food needs outside of pantry hours can be filled by calling the Community Church office. (info below.)
5. Food Benefit: Food is distributed on a per person basis predicated upon household size. Occasionally, a surplus of an item or items is available, and these items are provided to all pantry users, but do not count against their benefit limit. (Contact pantry for specifics that apply to your family.)
6. Geographic Area Served: western Vilas County.
7. Cost: None
8. Sample pantry: Serving various items such as frozen food including fruits, vegetables, and meat, refrigerated food, canned items, dry shelf food, and bakery items. Items offered vary on a week-to-week basis

Program Details:

1. Eligibility Requirements: Patrons must have income at or below 200% of the federal Poverty Guidelines established for their household size, per the Emergency Food Assistance Program. Income is determined by self-declaration.
2. Application/Intake Process: Pantry participants are asked to fill out The Emergency Food Assistance Program(TEFAP) Eligibility Application and certain pantry specific forms. Homeless persons do not require an address.
3. Food delivery process: Recipients come into the pantry to shop for needed items once per calendar week.
4. Emergency food: Food needs outside of pantry hours can be filled by calling the pantry contact. (See info below.)
5. Food Benefit: Patrons are able to shop for food items and amounts are based on household size.
6. Geographical Area Served: Wisconsin residents
7. Cost: None
8. Sample pantry items: Items include: canned goods (fruit, vegetables, soup, beans, tomatoes), dry shelf food, dairy, eggs, frozen food (meat, fruits, vegetables), and bakery items.

1. Eligibility Requirements: Income must be at or below 200% of the federal Poverty Guidelines for household size. Income is determined by self-declaration.
2. Application Process: Participants fill out a form that provides valid identification and proof of residency. Including the number of household members with names, and their birth dates. Homeless persons may use the address of a local service agency.
3. Food delivery process: An order form is turned into a volunteer upon arrival at the pantry. The food items are then selected, boxed, and brought out to the recipient's vehicle.
4. Emergency Food: Call contact info above.
5. Food Benefit: Food is predicated upon household size. Occasionally, a surplus of an item is available,, and these items are provided to all pantry users, but do not count against their benefit limit. (Contact pantry for specifics that apply to your family.)
6. Cost: None

12. FoodShare Wisconsin

- a. Program Description: FoodShare Wisconsin was created to help stop hunger and to improve nutrition and health for people with limited financial resources. It is a federal program that provides grants to the States, for purpose of reducing hunger and malnutrition in all eligible households across the nation. SNAP helps provide healthy food to qualifying low-income families with children, elderly or disabled in each state of the USA, including Wisconsin.
- b. Program Benefit: Qualified individuals receive an electronic card, like an ATM card, to buy eligible food in authorized retail food stores. The amount of the benefit is based upon an individual's circumstance.
- c. Program eligibility: To be eligible for FoodShare, a person must be a U.S. citizen or qualifying immigrant. A Social Security number (SSN) is required, or the person must apply for an SSN, for each person who is requesting FoodShare benefits. A food unit member cannot belong to more than one FoodShare assistance group.

Some members aged 16 to 59 must register for work to be FoodShare eligible. Some exceptions exist, including full-time students and parents caring for young children. Some members aged 18 to 54 must meet a separate FoodShare work requirement in order to maintain eligibility.

Unearned income, including any unearned income that is deemed from an ineligible member, may be counted.

Some types of unearned income include child support, unemployment compensation, Social Security, and W-2 payments. Earned Income, the food unit's gross earned income may be counted. Some types of earned income include wages, tips, and self-employment income.

The 200% federal poverty level (FPL) gross monthly income test applies to all broad-based categorically eligible food units as a condition of eligibility, with one exception. Elderly, blind, or disabled (EBD) food units have no gross monthly income test. Food units that include an EBD member with gross monthly income that exceeds 200% of the FPL must be tested for FoodShare using the regular SNAP rules. Under these rules, the assistance group (AG) has no gross monthly income test but must have a net monthly income that does not exceed 100% of the FPL and countable assets that do not exceed the EBD asset limit of \$4500.

Non-EBD food units, and their assistance group being tested under regular SNAP rules, must have income under the gross monthly income limit of 130% of the FPL. They must also pass the net income test of 100% of the FPL and their countable assets cannot exceed the non-EBD asset limit. \$3000.
